


## Fab Friday - March 30, 2024



Well, it's Saturday and I must ask your forgiveness for such late announcements. I hope that you have time to enjoy this before it is completely obsolete.

Baptism - I have learned, once again, so much since I joined the St John's Family. Before I was out for surgery, I was able to sit in on Fr. Nate's Sunday Forum for new members and those seeking confirmation. I am going to have to start over next year. This year, however, we studied "Being Christian" by Rowan Williams. For those of you who don't know that name, including me, he was the 104th (yes 104th) Archbishop of Canterbury from 2002-2012. What a marvelous overview of the essentials of Christianity from his perspective.

Per Archbishop Rowan, there are four essential elements of the Christian Life: baptism, Bible, Eucharist and prayer. The first chapter addresses baptism and I wanted to share a couple of quotes from the Bible and his text that spoke directly to me.

"Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore, we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we to might walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:3-4)

Now this may be a very familiar passage for you but it was new to me. I never thought of baptism and resurrection being so closely associated.

Another point he makes is "To be baptized is to recover the humanity that God first intended." "...baptism means being with Jesus 'in the depths'; the depths of human need, including the depths of our own selves

in their need -- but also in the depths of God's love; in the depths where the Spirit is re-creating and refreshing human life as God meant it to be." This explains just where I am in my spiritual development and a place I will return to often when the chaos of the world seems so overwhelming and ominous. I will remember that I am baptized in Him and find calm and orientation when I do.

This is a book you might want to pick up for your library. It has quickly become a favorite of mine as I wander through this thing called Christianity. Come, join me.
