

## Fab Friday - April 5, 2024



What a beautiful Holy Week and Easter Day we had at St. John's last week. There is so much going on that it is hard to participate in all of the services leading up to the Sunday of Resurrection. I hope that you were able to participate in some, if not all, of the services.

On Easter Day we had a record attendance of over 200 people between the two services. That is, a record in these post-Covid days. I loved to see the Nave so full on Sunday - so many visitors, some new and some returning, so many of you that we see every week. The children were a joy, happy and carefree. Those were the days.

Now we find ourselves immersed in the 50 days of Eastertide. Eastertide begins on Easter Sunday (which I always thought was part of Holy Week, though that is not the case) and ends on Whitsunday, otherwise known as the Day of Pentecost. Each Sunday of the season is treated as a Sunday of Easter. The first eight days constitute the Octave of Easter and are celebrated as solemnities of the Lord. Octave is the term applied to the whole period of these eight days, during which certain major feasts came to be observed. Early history tells us that the "eighth day" or *octava dies* was associated with the weekly Christian celebration of the resurrection of Christ every "eighth day", which became a name for Sunday.

The solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is celebrated on the 40th day of Eastertide (a Thursday). The nine days from the Feast of the Ascension until the Saturday before Pentecost (inclusive) are days of preparation for the Holy Spirit.

Eastertide is a season of joy. The liturgical color is white (and sometimes gold), which is the color designated for feasts and festivals. The Paschal Candle is lit on Easter and on Sundays during Eastertide. Eastertide ends on the Day of Pentecost. The Easter lily, a symbol of the resurrection, traditionally serve as the chancel flowers that decorate the chancel area of churches.

Of course, there is much more to be said about Eastertide. Maybe you will have some time to do a little digging of your own.

Here is the <u>bulletin for this Sunday.</u> The weather will be warm so come to church, if only to see the beauty that is the Memorial Garden in the front of the church. Spring has sprung at St. John's Episcopal Church!
