Maundy Thursday - The Agape Dinner Returns



St. James's Food Pantry is in need of cereal. We are collecting boxes of cereal through Palm Sunday, April 2. Our goal is to collect 50 boxes. There is a bin set up in the Narthex for donations.

Teacher's Toolbox is in need of washable Crayola markers and a variety of color copy paper at this time. Our teachers so appreciate your donations.
