

Fab Friday - April 19, 2024 A Day of Remembrance



Do you remember?

As with many occasions in history, you will probably remember just where you were and what you were doing at 9:02 on April 19, 1995 - the day that the Murrah Building was bombed, leaving 168 people dead and hundreds more injured.

I know where I was. At that time, I was living in Wickenburg, Arizona. It just so happened that on that day, and at that moment, I was packing to move to a new home when the "breaking news" interrupted the program I had on the television. I remember thinking at the time - NO, I must be hearing things. But I wasn't. Oklahoma City had been attacked by a terrorist - not from Russia or the Middle East but from our own country. From America! It just couldn't be true.

Immediately I was on the phone to contact my parents but all the lines were tied up and it took

hours to get through. In the meantime, I remained glued to the TV in tears as I watched firefighters and police officers moving in and out of the area, often helping or carrying people from the rubble. I will never forget when a firefighter was shown carrying out a 1-year-old baby who was one of 19 that would die that day.

"Where was God that day?" people asked. A question often asked in the light of a catastrophic event. Well, here is where I found God. God was in the response, not only of Oklahomans but of people around the world! God was found in the angels who left their homes and families and traveled long distances to be a part of the recovery efforts that would take weeks and months. God was working through the Oklahomans that came together in churches across the state to pray for the fallen. God worked his compassionate miracles through the emergency workers that were there, not thinking of themselves but only of those trapped in the building. God was in the response!

That's where I find God. These days, with all the chaos, descension, anger and infighting, I wonder where God is! I worry that the division in our country will result in a "civil war" - brothers and sisters in conflict with one another. Neighbors, fellow church members, children completely divided and willing to fight it out. Then I remember. It's simple - God is our HOPE. Hope that we will stop seeing Americans killing fellow Americans. Hope that we will come together, listen to one another and find solutions to our differences, solutions that we can all live with. Compromise, forgiveness, and love. That's where we will find God.

This morning, I happened once again to have the television on as the ceremony to commemorate the bombing was aired. As the crowd listened soberly to the speeches of the Mayor, Governor and the Secretary of the Interior, Deb Halland, I heard those messages from our political leaders. The speeches were astonishing and advocated for coming together with solutions rather than the anger and stubborn, righteous indignation that has ended in violence EVERYDAY in all places in our world.

Let our St. John's family lead the way in prayerful compromise, listening to one another, working together to create a better community within our small part of the world. Let us reach out to others who are mired in the mud of discontent, invite them in and love them as we so deeply love one another. That's where we will find God.
