

Fab Friday - March 22, 2024



I love putting this little message together each week. I always learn things I didn't know but should. So, I turn to the Internet for information and cross my fingers that this missive is at least somewhat accurate. I will trust in Fr. Nate to let me (and maybe even you) know when I make a terrible faux pas. For those of you who are new to the Episcopal faith and St. John's, perhaps this information will be helpful to you.

This week, we are beginning Holy Week by celebrating the Feast of the Annunciation on Monday evening. The Feast of the Annunciation is observed almost universally throughout Christianity. It commemorates the visit of the archangel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary, during which he informed her that she would be the mother of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. I was confused at first when Fr. Nate suggested we celebrate this on the Monday of Holy Week when it has always been part of the Christmas story to me. Until he explained - I will try to repeat basically what he told me.

Generally, the Annunciation is celebrated on March 25 each year, commemorating both the belief that the spring equinox was not only the day of God's act of Creation but also the beginning of Christ's redemption of that same Creation - or in other words, the resurrection and the redemption of our sins. Since the world was created in spring, Christ was also conceived and died shortly after the equinox of spring. In other words, the Annunciation is essential to the Resurrection.

This year, we are celebrating the Annunciation on March 25, the day intended. In the tradition of the Western Churches, the feast is moved if necessary to prevent it from falling during Holy Week (Don't know why - it's just what Wickipedia said). Typically, the Annunciation would be moved to the Monday after the after the Second Sunday of Easter to avoid Holy Week.

Holy Week is the most sacred week in the liturgical year in Christianity. It is the sixth and last week of Lent, beginning with Palm Sunday and concluding on Holy Saturday. In addition to the Feast of the Annunciation, which will be a spoken Eucharist in the Lady Chapel, we have a full schedule of services as we follow Jesus to the Cross. Palm Sunday will include a full congregational processional into the Nave and reading of the Passion according to Mark.

On Wednesday, we will have the final Stations of the Cross and Thursday is Maundy Thursday. We will start our service on Maundy Thursday with an Agape supper, reminiscent of the Last Supper. This will include the Mandatum (The Washing of Feet) symbolizing Christ's washing the feet of his disciples on that night. Immediately following the meal and the service associated with it, we will process into the Nave from Wade-Dalton Hall to finish the services with a solemn Procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose, hymns and the Stripping of the Altar.

Immediately following the service, members of St. John's will be at the Altar of Repose in the Lady Chapel to offer silent prayer for one hour each throughout the night, just as Jesus asked his disciples to do. Note here: even if you aren't signed up for an hour on our schedule, you are welcome to come to pray as well.

There will be two services on Good Friday - spoken communion from the Reserved Sacrament at both noon and 7:00pm. Holy Week concludes with Christ's rest in death and descent into hell on Holy Saturday. We will meet at 5:30pm for the Great Vigil which will include two baptisms this year - Colton and Chasen Jackson will be baptized and receive their first Eucharist that evening.

And, of course, the week concludes with the glorious Sunday of the Resurrection. For you early birds, and those who enjoy outdoor services, we will start the day with a 7:30 service in the Peace Chapel. Easter breakfast will be served at 9:15 in Wade Dalton and will be a family friendly menu all should enjoy. The Easter Day Festive Eucharist will be uplifting and joyful following the solemn week before, ending with an Easter Egg hunt for the many children of St John's Church.

Here is your bulletin for this coming Sunday service.



The night before he was crucified, Jesus spent several hours in the Garden of Gethsemane in anguished prayer. When his disciples fell asleep, he pled with them to stay awake to pray, asking, "Can you not watch with me one hour?"

Remembering this, and as an act of devotion, Christians have traditionally kept vigil throughout the night leading from Maundy Thursday into Good Friday.

This vigil is a time to pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament and to watch and wait while contemplating the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross.

Sign up in the Narthex for one hour to watch and wait with Jesus.

CAIR Needs our Help

As part of their continued support of our new Afghan neighbors, the Council on American Islamic Relations (CAIR) is partnering with YMCA again this year to host a Newcomer "Eid ul-Fitr" Festival for the Afghan community, and they need our help. St. John's has been asked to collect candy donations for the goodie bags that each child will receive at the festival.

"Eid" (rhymes with "feed") marks the end of the month-long dawn-to-sunset fasting of <u>Ramadan</u> and is celebrated by <u>Muslims</u> worldwide.

IMPORTANT: the candies must meet Islamic dietary laws ("halal"), that is, they can't contain gelatin as gelatin can be derived from pork products. To make it easy, below is a list of commonly available candies and treats that are halal. Note that the listing of brand names is intentional as not all manufacturers of these items may be halal. Also, candies must be individually wrapped and party-size (not full-size).

Tic-Tacs, Reese's Peanut Butter Cups, Reese's Pieces, Reeses's Peanut Butter Filled Eggs, Regular and Chewy Granola Bars, Nestle chocolates, Butterfingers, caramels, butterscotch, M&M's (both peanut and plain), Snickers, Three Musketeers, Mars Bars, Twix, Skittles, Hershey bars, Baby Ruth, Kit Kats, York Peppermint Patties, and Cadbury Creme Eggs. **(They like chocolate)**

CAIR will be assembling 500 goodie bags so we will need as much candy as we can get - we can do this! Please place your donations in the designated collection basket in the narthex by Palm Sunday, March 24.
