It's hard to believe that Ash Wednesday and Lent are already upon us! It is really early this year. And Spring seems to be coming early this year too - have you noticed some plants already in bloom?

Ash Wednesday has a very interesting history and story behind it. Ash Wednesday is the start of the Easter season as it marks the beginning of Lent. Ashes were often used as a symbol of sorrow for sin in the Bible. Though Ash Wednesday itself isn't mentioned in the Bible, we find the use of ashes in the book of Daniel where ashes were first associated with penance.

The use of ashes as a symbolic gesture has early roots, all the way back to the 11th century. Because Lent is a time for fasting, self-sacrifice, and repentance, Pray - Fast - Give, it makes sense to begin the 40-day period with a symbolic gesture of solemnity.

The practice of spreading ashes on foreheads became widespread in the U.S. as recently as the 1970s. It was part of a wider trend in American religion of people wanting to connect their physical and spiritual lives. The mark became an obvious association with religion that people embraced, as they could wear it throughout the day.

Across the nation, people will gather in churches for the imposition of ashes this coming Wednesday. In some areas of the country, you will find volunteer clergy and deacons on the corners or in the mall (Ashes to Go) imposing ashes for those who have no church home.

Please join us on this solemn occasion as we begin this Lenten season.


