Daylight saving time is coming to an end on Sunday, bringing us an extra hour of sleep and a return to standard time. The ending of daylight saving time means that the sun will be out earlier in the morning BUT the evenings will get darker sooner. And the days will be getting shorter as December passes.

But such is life in the daylight savings time world.

I was spoiled for 35 years living in Arizona - where the time never changes. But that had its drawbacks as well. I could never remember the time difference between Arizona and Oklahoma, or Denver, or New York.

What do you think of returning to standard time? There is a lot of debate on the subject. The American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM) has issued a new position statement recommending the elimination of seasonal time changes. About 20 other health organizations have signed that statement, which sleep experts say aligns best with the human "body clock." Daylight savings time messes with our body clocks and can have negative impact on our quality of life.

Now that the church's festivities to celebrate the 25th Anniversary of the Nave and the recognition of the choir have passed, you can look forward to a less eventful month than October. October was a doozy.

Adult Formation - Year A: Matthew's Gospel Lesson Seven Discussion Questions


