As I was thinking about this coming Sunday, Rose Sunday as we refer to it, it occurred to me that I didn't really know why this particular Sunday in Lent is given this name, allows flowers on the altar and the frontal on the altar is pink instead of purple as usual in Lent. So I went searching and found some interesting information.

Did you know that this coming Sunday is Laetare Sunday? According to the official website of The Episcopal Church, Laetare Sunday is always the fourth Sunday of Lent. The Latin *laetare* is an imperative: "rejoice!". On this day, the church is called to joyful anticipation of the victory to be won. This joyful theme provides lightening from the penitential emphasis of Lent. Since the thirteenth century the celebrant of the eucharist has been permitted to wear rose-colored vestments which express the change of tone in the Lenten observance. Laetare Sunday therefore may be called "Rose Sunday." This custom is not required in the Episcopal Church, but it is observed by some parishes with a traditional Anglo-catholic piety.

There is a lot more history to Laetare Sunday than I have shared here. I encourage you to explore Wikipedia for oodles of information and resources, if you are truly curious.

As part of their continued support of our new Afghan neighbors, the Council on American Islamic Relations (CAIR) is partnering with YMCA again this year to host a Newcomer "Eid ul-Fitr" Festival for the Afghan community, and they need our help. St. John's has been asked to collect candy donations for the goodie bags that each child will receive at the festival.

"Eid" (rhymes with "feed") marks the end of the month-long dawn-to-sunset fasting of Ramadan and is celebrated by Muslims worldwide.

**IMPORTANT:** the candies must meet Islamic dietary laws ("halal"), that is, they can't contain gelatin as gelatin can be derived from pork products. To make it easy, below is a list of commonly available candies and treats that are halal. Note that the listing of brand names is intentional as not all manufacturers of these items may be halal. Also, candies must be individually wrapped and party-size (not full-size).

Tic-Tacs, Reese's Peanut Butter Cups, Reese's Pieces, Reeses's Peanut Butter Filled Eggs, Regular and Chewy Granola Bars, Nestle chocolates, Butterfingers, caramels, butterscotch, M&M's (both peanut and plain), Snickers, Three Musketeers, Mars Bars, Twix, Skittles, Hershey bars, Baby Ruth, Kit Kats, York Peppermint Patties, and Cadbury Creme Eggs. (They like chocolate)

CAIR will be assembling 500 goodie bags so we will need as much candy as we can get - we can do this! Please place your donations in the designated collection basket in the narthex <u>by Palm</u> Sunday, March 24.
