To salute, as it were—to stand at attention when she enters the room—when we hear the great voice saying, "Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and he will dwell with them, and they shall be his people, and God himself shall be with them, and be their God." To lay our hands upon our hearts as we hear that God will wipe away all tears from the war-torn eyes of those who have battled the ravaging effects of the world, the flesh, and the devil, and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away. Behold, Christ makes all things new.
