Thank God the Episcopal church, with others, has kept the study of saints alive and well. They are exemplars, though not as the world would typically give us. They have created few war strategies. All worthwhile things, but the saints come to us in different form, because they are governed by different standards.

They've come to terms with moral standards, though they are not moralistic. They've embraced death and self-sacrifice, though not at the expense of their humor. They have embraced hard work, though usually without compensation. They've embraced obscurity in life, and then stood as giants in death. They are working with different standards. Great men and women lead exaggerated, epoch-making lives dismissive of the prevailing "balanced" or "holistic" lifestyles around them. To these few do we owe the great shifts in cultural tide. They hold to a bedrock of moral principles, having come to terms with their own conscience. They have courage: "fair is their prize and great their hope."

Blessed are you who are poor (in any way), for yours is the kingdom of God.

- ²² 'Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. ²³Rejoice on that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.
- ²⁴ 'But woe to you who are rich,

for you have received your consolation.

²⁵ 'Woe to you who are full now,

for you will be hungry.

'Woe to you who are laughing now,

for you will mourn and weep.

²⁶ 'Woe to you when all speak well of you,

for that is that their ancestors did to the false prophets.

²⁷ 'But I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, ²⁸bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. ²⁹If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. ³⁰Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. ³¹Do to others as you would have them do to you.
